DATA PROCESSING PURPOSES

The data provided by completing the form will be processed by the Company to respond to requests for information on the Company itself and/or its products/services.

LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING DATA

Execution of the contract involving the data subject.

DATA RETENTION PERIOD

This data will be retained for 24 month to respond to requests for information. Once this period has lapsed or the request has been completed, personal data will be destroyed or made anonymous compatibly with technical erasure and backup procedures.

DATA PROVISION COMPULSORINESS

Data marked with an asterisk (*) in the data collection form must be provided to be able to provide the information requested, therefore if this information is absent the Company will not be able to process the request.

DATA RECIPIENTS

Personal data may be communicated to parties acting as data controllers (such as supervisory bodies and authorities and public organisations authorised to request data) or processed on behalf of the Company by parties appointed as data processors, who are provided with suitable operating instructions, e.g. companies that manage/maintain the company website;

PARTIES AUTHORISED TO PROCESS DATA

Data may be processed by employees in company departments who are responsible for carrying out the activities outlined above and have been authorised to process the data and have received suitable operating instructions.

DATA SUBJECTS' RIGHTS - COMPLAINT TO THE SUPERVISORY BODY

By contacting the Company via e-mail sent to privacy@enter.eu, data subjects can ask the controller for access to personal data, or the correction or deletion of personal data, and also have the right to restrict processing of the data in the cases set out in article 18 GDPR, and object to processing in the case of legitimate interests of the controller.

Furthermore, in the case where processing is based on consent or a contract and carried out with automated tools, data subjects have the right to receive the personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format, and to transmit the data to another data controller without obstruction.

Data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint to the competent Supervisory Authority in the member state where they are resident or where they work, or the member state where the alleged breach took place.

¹What is the right of restriction?

It is the temporary processing of data which consists of data conservation only, in the following cases:

- The data subject contests the accuracy of his/her personal data, for the time necessary for the controller to verify the accuracy;
- The processing is unlawful because the data subject is against his/her data erasure and requests the restriction of their use;
- The data controller no longer needs the personal data but data subject needs his/her data for court proceedings purposes;
- The data subject objects to the processing pursuant to art. 21.1 pending the verification whether the legitimate grounds of the controller override his/her legitimate grounds.
